



Martin Park Market







Historical Population Trends in Martin Park







MARTIN PARK Community Engaged

1. Representatives from PRMXA at Halley, Northstar and the Martin Park District Association should collaboratively schedule ongoing meetings with the University President's office in order to strengthen working relationships.

2. The community should have an <u>annual</u> community building event to *remain engaged* with each other.

3. Martin Park residents and organizations who are in conflict, should enter into a resolution process with a third party in order to resolve underlying communication issues.

4. The Martin Park Community Association should meet <u>regularly</u> with <u>church leadership</u> in Martin Park to *strategize community building*.
